



### Ladybird house

Build a snug house where ladybirds can spend winter.



**Towering Twigs**

Collect lots of **sticks**, find a quiet, sheltered spot and pile them up. Stuff the gaps with **smaller sticks** and **dry leaves**.

**Hidey hole**

Using **scissors**, cut the bottom third off a **2 litre plastic bottle**. Stuff it full of **sticks** and old **bamboo**, then fill the gaps with **dry leaves** and **grass**.

Hang it in a tree or bush about one metre from the ground. Stop rainwater pooling by making tiny drainage holes in the bottom. Now wait for the minibeasts to move in!



**Pine cone palace**

Fill an **old basket** with **pine cones** and **leaves** or **shredded newspaper**.

Place it in a sheltered spot, or in your shed or garage.



**Other minibeasts might make use of the house too, so keep your eyes peeled.**
